Frequently Asked Questions: Bishop's Confirmation Retreat

What do we need to bring with us to registration on Sunday?

Please help us make registration run smoothly by bringing the following items with you to registration:

- 1. Medications: Medication should be in its original packaging, in a clear zip-loc bag, labeled with the student's full name and dosage instructions.
- 2. Forms: OTC meds form, Health Form

What is the lodging like? How will be assigned sleeping facilities?

Lazy W Ranch is a typical "summer camp" set in a beautiful yet rustic environment. You will be placed in cabins according to church groups—genders will be separated. You may share the cabin with other church groups. The cabins fit 10 people per and there are no bathrooms located inside the cabins—yes, be prepared to walk to a bathhouse. ©

What if there is an emergency in our family?

In an emergency, the camp staff may be contacted at (949) 728-0758. This is a direct line to the infirmary and is only to be used in case of emergency. If there is no answer at that number, you may try the camp line at 949-728-0141, which has voicemail.

What if my child gets sick or injured at camp?

Children often get cuts, scrapes, bumps and bruises as well as stomachaches and other minor complaints. Our camp Nurse will treat these illness and injuries as they arise. If the injury is deemed severe by the Nurse and/or members of the Leadership Team you will be contacted via phone with details regarding the injury/illness. You may be asked to pick up your child or for instructions on how to proceed.

I'm an adult coming with my students, what should I expect?

Adults attending with their students will be an active part of the weekend and will provide small group leadership throughout the course of the event. You will participate in the activities lead by the Design Team and will then lead the students in discussions based around those activities. Don't worry! We'll provide the discussion questions for those occasions.

Can I bring my phone? Or camera? Music player?

You are strongly encouraged to leave all expensive items at home, including cell phones and other handheld devices. Should you choose to bring one of these items with you then you are taking full responsibility for it and will not be reimbursed if the device breaks and/or is lost.

IMPORTANT: There is NO cell reception on camp property. Zero! Zilch!

Wifi is also not available for students. Leaders, only, will have access to wifi if needed.

So, technology stuff is allowed at camp?

Cell phones/music players will ONLY be allowed IN the cabins. If the phone or device is seen as a distraction or a problem, an adult may collect the phone until the end of the event.

What should I bring?

Read the recommended packing list closely for suggestions on what to bring and also be sure to check out the page on Special Notes for anything unique to your chosen week of camp.

• Sleeping Bag/Sheets



Directions to Lazy W Ranch Camp

Please <u>DO NOT</u> use 'MAPQUEST' to find directions, as they do not have correct directions posted. Lazy W Ranch Camp is located 70 miles south of Los Angeles and 70 miles north of San Diego.



From the Los Angeles and San Diego areas:

- Travel on Interstate 5 to San Juan Capistrano in south Orange County
- Exit on Hwy 74 (Ortega Highway)
- Go EAST (towards mountains) 12.5 miles
- Turn LEFT onto Hot Springs Canyon Road (look for Lazy W Ranch Camp sign and San Juan Fire Station ON LEFT)
- Drive 1.5 miles to the end of dirt/paved road into Lazy W Ranch Camp

NOTE: Due to construction, there is often a great deal of traffic at the 5 and Ortega Highway. As a result we encourage you to take the Junipero Serra exit. If you are coming from the North, take the Junipero Serra exit, make a left onto Junipero Serra and then turn RIGHT onto Rancho Viejo. Travel approximately 1.5 miles and make a left onto Ortega. Then follow above directions.

From the South, a detour option is the Camino Capistrano exit. Take the exit, turn left, make the right onto San Juan Creek Road, then make a left onto La Novia. Turn right onto Ortega Highway. Dependent upon traffic conditions this detour may not save time.

- Take 91 West
- To 15 South
- Travel through the outskirts of Lake Elsinore, Google directions are accurate
- Turn onto Ortega
- Travel 15.8 miles, turn right onto Hot Springs Canyon Road · Drive 1.5 miles to the end of the road into Lazy W Ranch
